# LAW SCHOOL?

Entering law school can be daunting, but it doesn't have to be...

## 1. Undergrad

There are no specific majors which are required in order to pursue a law degree. All that is required is an undergraduate degree of some kind. With that being said, some popular undergraduate degrees for law school applicants are:

- Political Science
- English
- Philosophy
- Ethics, Society and Law
- Criminology
- Psychology

## 2. Write Your LSAT

The LSAT exam is an extremely important part of your law school application. Many law schools in Canada require LSAT scores as part of your application. The LSAT score ranges from 120 to 180, and a competitive score is considered to be within the 155-165+ range. Some tips for your LSAT are:

- Give yourself 4 to 6 months to study
- Ensure to start by reading the LSAT prep book and/or taking an LSAT prep course
- Ensure to do TIMED practice test; it is important to emulate the actual context of the test

## 3. Pick a Law School

There are 24 law schools in Canada to choose from, with many more around the world. Each has their own application requirements, so be sure to check the specifics of whichever law school you decide upon. Law school degrees usually take 3 years, so be sure to choose a school you will enjoy attending!

## 4. Apply to Law School

Applying to law school will require you to submit a package of documents including but not limited to:

- List of Extra Curriculars/Employment
- Undergraduate Transcripts
- Reference Letters
- Personal Statements

**GET INVOLVED!** - Extra curriculars can distinguish you from other candidates.  
**MAKE CONNECTIONS!** - Reference letters are crucial, yet often overlooked.  
**DIVERSIFY!** - Mold yourself into a well rounded and interesting person.
